As of December 9, 2021, the survey date, there were 22 out of 70 students, or 31% of the LHS population eligible for Impact Aid (IA); all those eligible were either living on, or had parents working on the San Carlos Apache Reservation and all were Native American. Of each program or service offered by Liberty, the percentage of Impact Aid students participating was, on average, 33%, slightly above the actual Impact Aid student percentage of 31% of the school population, thus, an equally proportionate distribution of school services was given to IA students. Note: February ACT* was not available to any of our LHS students due the pandemic, so was not included in the calculations.

The Impact Aid allotment for the fiscal year so far, \$ 51,906, has been used for teacher retention bonuses to support our highly qualified teacher population, and for 15% of teacher salaries, as well as 30% of bus driver salary for a subtotal this far, of \$ 43,167. Additional amounts will be spent on transportation costs for fuel, maintenance and repair of the bus and van used for San Carlos transport.
